## Letter from the President

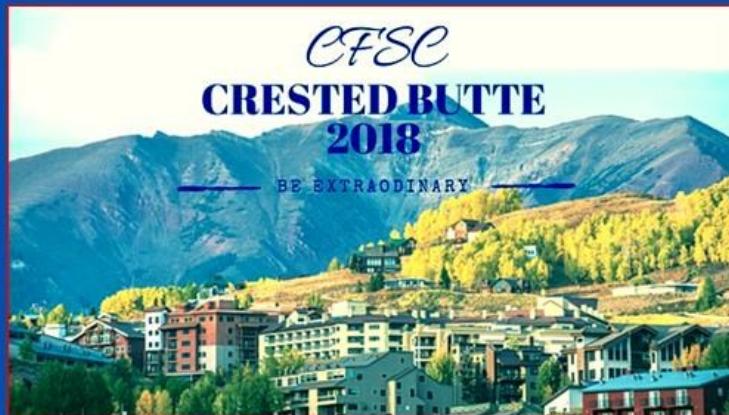

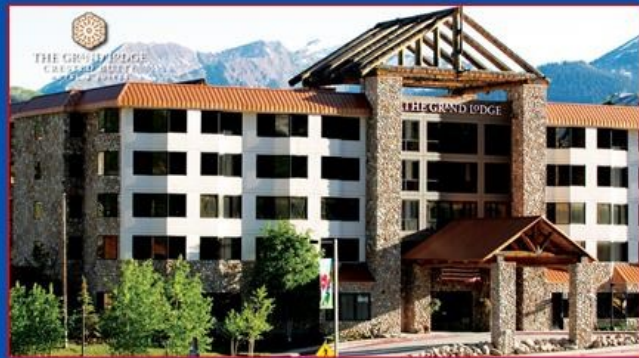
