### 1. Meeting Dates:

The meetings are usually held the first Friday of each month. Unless we vote differently, it will stay that way. The meeting times vary depending on how much work we have to do, but usually start at 9:00 A.M. and go through lunch. The committee meetings are held first, and then the entire board meets for progress reports from each committee. Lunches and lodging (if needed) are at your own expense.

### 2. Participation on committees:

All board members need to decide which committees they want to serve on. Everyone serves on more than one committee. Participation includes offering opinion and input, sharing of duties specific to the committee, occasional phone calls/emails/internet research, etc. from home or work, and setting up various displays at the conference.

### 3. Meeting Attendance:

All Directors may attend and participate in board meetings, with voting privileges; however, past presidents and honorary members shall not have proxy voting privileges. Participation at any meeting of the Board via teleconferencing, if available, shall be considered attendance. Missing three consecutive board meetings automatically removes you from the board.

### ♦ AGENDA

This committee is responsible for determining the conference training tracks and aligning presenters for each class

### ⋄ REGISTRATION
